

CMOS Toronto Centre Seminar Climate in the Age of Empire

Canada has a long scientific heritage in weather and climate observations. Records kept by early Canadian observers reveal the tremendous efforts that went into recording weather and climate in Canada over the past three centuries.

Millions of these historical weather observations still exist in paper and ink form. Data transcribed by volunteer citizen scientists show how historical records can reveal surprising events in our climatic past.

Volunteers continue to turn past records into current science by transcribing historical weather data through McGill's Data Rescue: Archives and Weather.
